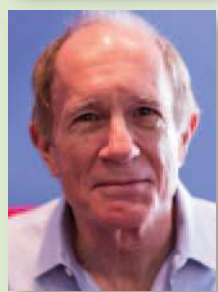

WHATABURGER Partnership Spotlight



• Tell us a bit about how this partnership came about.

Whataburger has been in the Houston community for nearly 50 years. This particular partnership started five years ago (2014) when Whataburger first became involved with the Back2School program through The Rod Ryan Morning show.

• Is there a moment during the years that stands out to you?

What stands out the most are the big smiles on the faces of the children when they receive their backpack full of supplies. Receiving the new backpack, supplies, books for reading and other goodies really does bring them confidence and joy. You can see it in their faces.

• What programs have Whataburger been a part of?

With HCC, Whataburger supports the Annual Easter Party, A Better Night's Sleep program, Christmas Toy Distribution at the George R. Brown. In addition to our HCC partnerships, Whataburger has been supporting the communities it serves through charitable giving and volunteerism since the first restaurant was opened in 1950. Whataburger

supports a number of nonprofit organizations that focus on children's charities, cancer research, hunger assistance, disaster relief and military support.

Academics, Backpacks, Classmates

With each approaching school year there comes mixed feeling for everyone in the family. A fresh start. Homework. Catching up with old friends. Demands of extracurricular activities. Moving up to the next grade. Report Cards. Fear of not knowing anyone in your class. But the anxiety of not being prepared with supplies should never cross one's mind.

Houston Children's Charity began the **Back2School** program, in 2005, to alleviate that tension of not being equipped on Day 1 of a new school year. It began with a single school district. Now our **Back2School** program includes many districts and covers over five counties. We believe ALL children should enter the doors on the first day wearing a new backpack loaded with supplies.

Each summer this program helps thousands of underserved children in the Houston area. Since teaming up with **Rod Ryan of The Rod Ryan Show on 94.5 The Buzz** in 2010, the support given has proven to be inspiring. Year after year, Rod and his crew set a new standard with contributions from local businesses to get our special children backpacks full of age appropriate supplies...and this year was no different.

Funds were raised through a variety of sources. The **Meat Raffle**, at **Lucky's Pub West**, brought in **\$16,644** to start off the campaign. Special thanks to **Bellville Meat Market** and **Ben E Keith Foods** for donating all meat products for this event. Weekly partnerships sought great participation from "The Best Listeners" in Houston. **Squeezedonline.com**, **Jim Adler the "Texas Hammer"**, **Shell Federal Credit Union** and **Primeway Federal Credit Union**, all contributed **\$5,000** to the cause. This year Whataburger donated **\$7,500** while **The Rod Ryan Show Cares** website raised an astonishing **\$35,700** towards the program. Thanks to **Brand Management Professionals** for the amazing items which everyone purchased through the RRSC online store.

On **April 17, 2019**, Houston Children's Charity awarded **15 wheelchair-accessible vehicles** through its renowned **Chariots for Children** program. Our generous sponsors **Jana & Richard Fant** with **The Fant Foundation**, **The Guill Family**, the **Gary Becker Family/ Brian Becker Family** and **Leticia & Steve Trauber** each donated state-of-the-art vans.

HCC President & CEO, **Laura Ward**, alongside long-time HCC friend **Patrick Fertitta**, proudly introduced each van recipient while presenting the keys to the brand-new vans.

The event which took place at HCC Chairman of the Board **Tilman J. Fertitta's Willie G's Post Oak** and featured a sweet treat of cookies and milk as well as festive Easter decorations. Each child was thrilled to see Easter Baskets that were placed in their waiting chariots.

Chariots for Children partner, **Adaptive Driving Access**, supplied the 15 brand-new vans. Chosen recipients of this program gain a reliable and efficient way to travel as a family to everything from medical treatments and doctor's appointments to after-school activities and adventures that were once unattainable.

Since its inception in 1996, Houston Children's Charity has raised over **\$6 Million** for the program, and has awarded over **205 vehicles** to **95 agencies** and **111 individual families**.

2019 VAN RECIPIENTS

Since 1996, HCC has awarded 91 passenger vans, 111 wheelchair-accessible vehicles, 3 box trucks, 1 car and 2 vehicle modifications to 95 agencies and 111 individual families.



Rachael Adeyeye – Age: 18
At birth, Rachael was diagnosed with Trisomy 18. Today, she suffers from Seizures, Scoliosis, and developmental delay. Rachael was recently named Student of the Month at her school for helping to spread awareness about Trisomy 18. Her parents, Sarah and Tayo, are very proud. She loves music, PE, and art but she does NOT enjoy getting her hair done and will throw a fit when someone tries. Rachael has two older brothers, David and Moses, who are in college but love helping to care for her when they are home.



JayCeon Davis – Age: 6
JayCeon suffers from Quadriplegic Cerebral Palsy, Seizures, and developmental delay. Like any kid, JayCeon loves ice cream and his favorite superhero is Batman. He loves cartoons. His favorite is Mickey Mouse Clubhouse which he enjoys watching with his brothers, Jayvion and Kemarion. JayCeon has a great relationship with his siblings and is most happy when they sing songs together.



Alexia N. Flores – Age: 11
Alexa is an 11 year old girl who suffers from Cerebral Palsy, impaired mobility, and seizures. Alexa loves her sister and is very close to her. She also really enjoys listening to music-- mostly ABBA, the Bee Gees, or anything with a good rhythm. Alexa loves cartoons, especially ones with animals as the main characters. More than anything, Alexa loves being outdoors and hopes to one day be able to walk with the help of a walker.



Julie Gatica – Age: 8
Julie was diagnosed with Encephalitis and a traumatic brain injury caused by Influenza B. Julie loves playing hide and seek with her brother, Alexander, or heading to waterparks for a fun day in the sun. She loves to eat and some her favorite foods include spaghetti, tortas and quesadillas. Julie loves helping others and she hopes to be a doctor when she grows up to help other kids like herself.



Ali Hussein – Age: 15
Ali suffers from Muscular Dystrophy. He comes from a big family and he loves spending time with them. His favorite part of the day is when his family comes home and tells him all of the details of their day. Ali loves being outside and going to parks which he hasn't been doing much of lately due to lack of transportation. His family can't wait to be able to get him in a van and back to a park soon!



Neave Ittman – Age: 19
Neave suffers from a rare genetic defect of the KCNT1 gene and she suffers from Seizures, Spastic Quadriplegia, and Scoliosis. She is described by her parents, Kelly & Keith, as "almost always happy and content." She is thrilled by flashing lights, music and movies at the theatre. She loves to ride in a wheelchair swing, or better yet, in a car, bus, or van, and the outings that come with them. When she is out in the world, she enjoys looking around at people and sights, and appreciates attention from loved ones.



Tommy E. Jackson III – Age: 10
Tommy suffers from Cerebral Palsy, Neuromuscular Scoliosis, and Chronic Static Encephalopathy. On the weekends, Tommy and his older sister, Tomia, enjoy watching Peppa Pig or Tommy's favorite movie, The Lion King. They both love music; they sing together or play on Tommy's toy guitar and mini piano. Mostly, Tommy just loves spending any quality time with his family and he never fails to light up with a big smile when his Dad greets him every day when he gets home from work.



Mia G. Lara – Age: 9
Mia has a past history of unknown Genetic syndrome. Her parents, Maria and Baldemar, describe Mia as an extremely happy child who is adored by her two older brothers, Marcos and Luis. She loves listening to music, even if it's just music that comes from a toy. Like any child, Mia enjoys watching cartoons and movies. Some of her favorites include Dora the Explorer, Rosita Fresita, and Frozen.



Jermaine McKinley – Age: 14
Jermaine suffers from Cerebral Palsy. Jermaine loves being out and about around other people, especially his siblings Jahlia and Jahniya who help take care of Jermaine whenever his mother, April, is not home. Jermaine enjoys laughing, listening to music, swimming and napping on trampolines. His favorite foods are pizza and green beans!



Bryce Mooring Jr. – Age: 3
A month after being born, Bryce was diagnosed with Arthrogryposis—which causes multiple joint contractions that affect nearly every area of his body. Now, Bryce is not able to move around like kids his age, but he doesn't let that stop him from enjoying life. He loves being walked through the zoo or spending time outside playing basketball with his dad. Some of Bryce's favorite things include the Trolls movie, pizza, chicken nuggets and his all-time favorite: ice cream!



Onyedikachi Onukwugha – Age: 11
Onyedikachi has suffered from Cerebral Palsy, Seizure disorder, and Multiple Sclerosis since birth. Despite his challenges, Onyedikachi enjoys playing with his siblings, Anthony and Mary, and loves to spend time with them outside at parks or watching the Lakewood Church gospel message on Sundays. They also love listening to music together, their favorite is Christian music. Onyedikachi loves watching the Disney channel and his favorite movie is Cars.



Steve Pacheco – Age: 18
Steve requires full-time care for his conditions which include severe global developmental delay, Seizure disorder, and Encephalopathy. Steve is non-verbal and is fed exclusively by G-tube feeds. His younger sisters, Emely and Melody, help to keep him motivated by singing him songs and reading to him. They know he is enjoying it when he smiles or claps his hands. Steve especially loves when his parents, Anabela and Domingo, talk to him and allow him to touch their faces.



Andres Perez – Age: 12
Andres suffers from Spina Bifida, Seizure Disorder, and Chronic Kidney Disease stage 3. He has been wheelchair bound since birth. Andres comes from a family of 6: his parents Sarina & Jorge and his siblings Vanessa, Jazmin and Jorge Jr. Andres loves when he is able to spend time with his family, especially when they are able to travel together. He also enjoys outdoor activities, his favorite being soccer.



Dnaize Scott – Age: 14
Dnaize suffers from Cerebral Palsy, Encephalopathy, and chronic airway obstruction. Dnaize and her siblings, Kana and Kameron, together with mom, enjoy pulling harmless pranks on each other and listening to R&B music. When the weather is good, they spend time going for walks and enjoying the outdoors. While Dnaize is non-verbal, she is most stimulated and happy when she is around her family and loved ones.



Christian Villegas – Age: 11
Christian, 11, lives with Scoliosis, Epilepsy, and Spastic Quadriplegic Cerebral Palsy. He is described by his parents, Lucero and Christian, as a joyful child who has "a strong view of life regardless of his disability." He loves going to the park in the afternoons and feeding animals or watching the ducks swim. Christian loves music; some of his favorite songs include the theme song to Paw Patrol and the viral YouTube Daddy Finger song.

It's Annual Easter Party time!!! The Easter Bunny hopped to the grounds of **Northland Christian School**, on **Saturday, April 6th** and continued a tradition of more than **350 children** from Houston-area agencies and families enjoying the day's activities by host **Houston Children's Charity**. Party-goers were treated to activities including a petting zoo, pony rides, moon walks, and train rides. Booths were set up for face painting, coloring and being creative with Play-Doh. Games were played, Eggs were hunted, and cotton candy and cookies were enjoyed by all.

Upon arrival guests received, metallic pinwheels, hand-decorated Easter Egg Hunt bags (decorated by **Girl Scout Troop Destiny** and **NCL – Wildflowers**) and bunny ears. We had a need to become more involved and engaged with the community through charitable services.

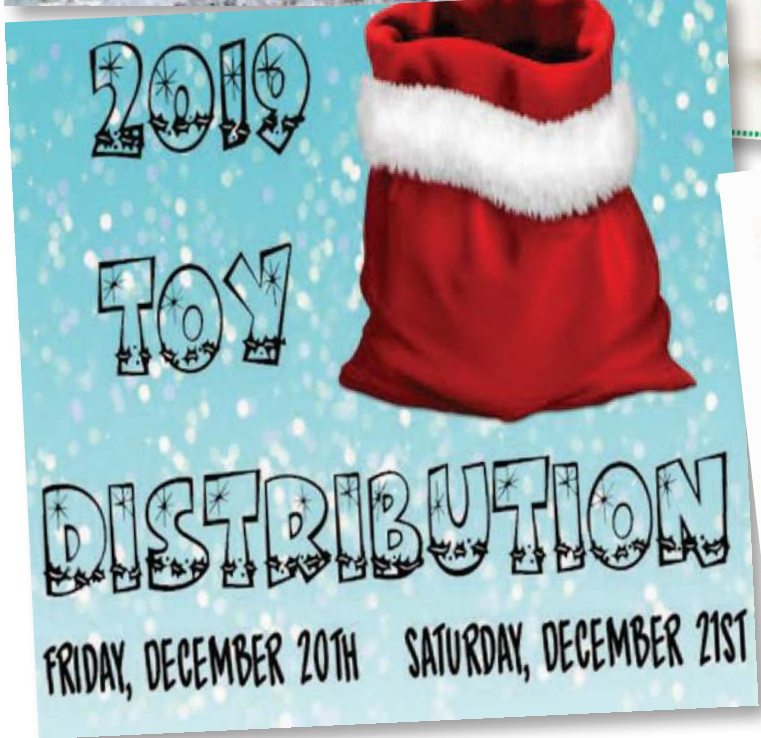
• What do you like best about serving as a HCC volunteer?
